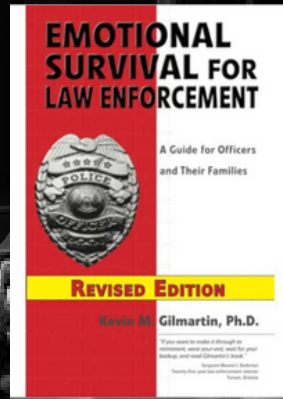

The goal of the course is to have the law enforcement professional review the potential impact the career causes in the personal life and to develop strategies for overall emotional survival. The strategies are designed to permit the professional to continue functioning effectively and ethically without burning out and without resorting to emotional isolation from friends and colleagues.

This course will further provide information that lets agencies keep officers committed and engaged in productive police work. The course also gives information to employees on how not to become a "self-perceived victim", a descriptor for an officer or employee that spends inordinate amounts of time resenting and resisting organizational and supervisory directive, as well as, suffering unnecessary destruction in the personal dimensions of their life.

Robert White is a retired Deputy Chief from the Flagstaff, Arizona Police Department, where he dedicated 31 years, serving in various line and command roles.
